2. All exhibits must have been produced by the exhibitors this year or in the previous year.

- 3. Grain may be exhibited as sheaves, in 1-peck boxes or in wide-mouth glass or clear plastic 1-gallon jars. Sheaves for all grain must be between 24-30 inches in total length. Sheaves must be 4 inches in diameter (across) at the widest point. Leaves must be stripped. Sheaves are to be tied in 3 places- near the top, in the middle and near the bottom. Note: No other size or amount of grain will be accepted except peck boxes or full 1-gallon jars.
- Cured hay must be exhibited in a 4-inch baleslice that is put in a <u>sealed</u> plastic garbage bag.

5. Each exhibit will receive a 1st – 6th placing ribbon according to judge's determination.

- Sugar beet displays must consist of three beets of uniform conformity, mounted with a single heavywire (preferably a straightened coat hanger with the end crimped). The taproot should be intact, and the root hairs removed. The beets should have NO sprangles or hollow crowns. Leaf petioles should be removed flush with the surface of the beet. The crown should be silver dollar size or smaller and horizontal to the root. All dirt must be removed being careful to avoid damaging the outer skin of the beet.
- 7. The largest single sugar beet displays should have all dirt and tops removed. Sprangles and root hairs should remain, and wire mounting is not required. Only 1st, 2nd, & 3rd places will be awarded based on weight of the root.
